

ACADEMICS

■ The Carnegie Foundation has designated UL Lafayette as a “Research University with High Research Activity.” That puts UL Lafayette in the same research category as Clemson, Auburn, Baylor and Syracuse universities. The only other Louisiana institution in the same category is the University of New Orleans.



- UL Lafayette is a selective admissions university.
- The University of Louisiana at Lafayette offers 80 undergraduate degree programs.
- There are 29 master’s degree programs and one post master’s certificate program.

■ Doctor of philosophy degrees are offered in applied language and speech sciences, biology, cognitive science, English, Francophone studies, mathematics, computer science and computer engineering. A doctor of education degree in educational leadership was recently added.

■ About 1,100 students are graduated each fall and spring.

■ Total Fall 2006 enrollment is 16,303, including 1,379 graduate students.

■ UL Lafayette has students from 48 states and possessions and from 92 foreign countries.

■ There are 605 international students.

■ 57% of the Fall 2006 student body are female and 43% are male.

■ 92% of all UL Lafayette students are from Louisiana.

NOTEWORTHY

- The B.I. Moody III College of Business Administration is included in the 2007 edition of Princeton Review’s *Best 282 Business Schools*.
- A \$10 million building is under construction that will house the Computer Science Department and the Center for Advanced Computer Studies.
- A four-story parking garage for students and visitors is expected to open on campus next summer.



■ Almost half of UL Lafayette’s 346 student-athletes and student support staff finished the Fall 2005 semester with a 3.0 GPA or better.

■ KRVS 88.7 radio station on campus was the first in its market to broadcast a digital signal. That new signal is the audio equivalent of high definition television.

■ The Louisiana Immersive Technologies Center is a state-of-the-art facility in University Research Park. It features several “visualization” environments that enable researchers to manipulate complex data into workable 3-D models. It’s supported by some of the most sophisticated supercomputers in the world.
