

ACADEMICS



■ The Carnegie Foundation has designated UL Lafayette as a "Research University with High Research Activity." That puts UL Lafayette in the same category as Clemson, Auburn, Baylor and Syracuse universities. The only other Louisiana institution in the same category is the University of New Orleans.

■ UL Lafayette is a selective admissions university.

■ The University of Louisiana at Lafayette offers 80 undergraduate degree programs.

■ There are 29 master's degree programs and one post master's certificate program.

■ Doctor of philosophy degrees are offered in applied language and speech sciences, biology, cognitive science, English, Francophone studies, mathematics, computer science and computer engineering. A doctor of education degree in educational leadership was recently added. It's a joint degree offered by UL Lafayette and Southeastern Louisiana University.

■ About 1,100 students are graduated each fall and spring.

■ Total Fall 2006 enrollment is 16,303, including 1,379 graduate students.

■ 57% of the Fall 2006 student body are female and 43% are male.

■ 92% of all UL Lafayette students are from Louisiana.

NOTEWORTHY

■ UL Lafayette's MBA program is included in the 2007 edition of Princeton Review's *Best 282 Business Schools*.

■ The Computer Science Department and the Center for Advanced Computer Studies moved into a new \$10 million building in January.

■ An on-campus parking garage for students and visitors is under construction.

■ KRVS 88.7 radio station on campus was the first in its market to broadcast a digital signal. That new signal is the audio equivalent of high definition television.

■ Zeke, UL Lafayette's first supercomputer,

was linked to the Louisiana Optical Network Initiative in December. In the time it takes a bullet to travel one foot, Zeke can complete 330 million calculations. In the blink of an eye, it can complete two billion calculations.

■ UL Lafayette's Ragin' Jazz is one of the top 10 college dance teams in the nation. It ranked third in the Division 1A hip hop category and 10th in dance during the Universal Dance Association's Collegiate Nationals competition in January.
