



Silent/Online Auction Rules & Regulations

- 1.) Must be 18 years of age or older to participate in this KPA online auction.
- 2.) The auction is set to begin at midnight on April 2, 2009. Items will be posted and up for review and bids. Bids will only be accepted via website. A bidder may bid on as many items as he/she would like.
- 3.) Daily updates will be posted by 7AM the following morning
- 4.) The auction will close on Saturday, May 2, 2009 at 3:00 p.m. Highest bid at that time will constitute a winner. All sales are final, no exceptions. KPA is not responsible for lost or stolen items. All items are sold as is. No Guarantee or warranty is made by the KPA.
- 5.) Prior to close of the auction, items that need to be shipped must be requested to be shipped once your bid is placed. If planned on getting item shipped, then all shipping costs will be winning bidder's responsibility. NOTE: If the shipped item is undeliverable due to incorrect address or any other shipping error, the winning bidder will be notified of error and given 3 business days to supply a solution. If after the 3 business days there is no contact or solution made by the highest bidder, then the item will go to the next highest bidder.
- 6.) A phone call and notification email will be sent to inform the winning bidders.
- 6.) Each item posted will have a minimum bid posted, failure to bid higher than regulations will not be considered.
- 7.) If items are being picked up in person, all items must be picked up within 5 business days of the closing of the auction at Bourgeois Hall (Friday May 8th, 2009 at 12:30 pm).
- 8.) All items are finalized and must be paid in full at or before pickup of item, or before item is shipped, either by cash or check only, no credit card payments are accepted. All checks should be made to Kinesiology Professional Association.

- 9.) In the event that an item is not picked up/arranged to be shipped by this time, said item will go to the next highest bidder at winning bidders price and so on, who will have 2 business days to pick up item or have item shipped.
- 10.) A blind auction will be held in the event that an item is not accounted for. All previous bidders will be contacted with rules and regulations regarding the blind auction and will have 3 days to submit highest bid.
- 12.) All Winning Bids are tax deductible if the winning bid is higher than the estimated market value. For more information, contact your financial advisor/accountant.
- 13.) Every student that participates is responsible for getting their businesses the UL tax ID upon request.
- 14.) This auction is conducted by the Kinesiology Professional Association (KPA). By participating in this auction, each participant agrees to abide by these rules of this auction and any decision of the KPA with respect to this auction. All decisions regarding winning bids are decided solely by the KPA with no challenges made by participants.

¹ Items donated by individual students:

For every item, one half of the final proceeds go to the KPA organization for club costs and the other half goes to the KPA member who received donation item to help pay expenses such as: travel fees and registration fees for conferences and conventions.

² Items donated by students & faculty:

For every item, one half of the final proceeds go to the KPA organization for club costs, research and other projects and the other half goes to the KPA member who received donation item to help pay expenses such as: travel fees and registration fees for conferences and conventions.

³ Items donated by a team of students:

For every item, one half of the final proceeds go to the KPA organization for club costs, research and other projects and the other half will be divided up between the KPA members who received donation item to help pay expenses such as: travel fees and registration fees for conferences and conventions.

⁴ Items donated by KPA and faculty:

For every item, one half of the final proceeds go to the KPA and the other half goes to the faculty member who received donation item in conjunction with KPA to help pay for

research and other projects. This is included but not limited to equipment, conference travel and other resources for KPA Student research projects.

⁵KPA Student Research Projects:

Brian J. Campbell, Ph.D., Biomechanics, has donated autographed items in his personal collection to invest in KPA research projects. Over the past 3 years Dr. Campbell and KPA members have presented research at 5 national conferences as well as published abstracts in 2 different national refereed journals. Funds can be used for KPA research purposes such as obtaining research equipment, paying for research expenses, and funding travel expenses for the presentation of research which involves KPA students.
